

Not only will she be sorely missed, she will be extremely difficult to replace. My guess is that a number of us will have to step up and volunteer for duty to cover all the things that Libby has done for us. Finally, let me share with you an update on our "front entrance" project. As I reported last year, we finished the first phase of this project, re-landscaping the "wall-sign" area at Graystone Lane and Pfeiffer Ranch Road.

The next phase of the project is to extend the retaining wall along the right hand side of Pfeiffer Ranch, which is on City of San Jose property, to eliminate the erosion problem. As you can see, mud slides come down the hill and over the sidewalk and into the street each winter.

We are applying for a CAP grant (Community Action & Pride Grant) from the City of San Jose to help us pay for this project. Potentially the grant will cover 75% of the cost of the retaining wall. The application is due at the end of this month and we should know within 30 days of submission if we will receive an award. The cost of the wall is estimated at \$17,000. Our share of the project cost could be under \$5,000. Obviously, without the CAP grant, this project is difficult to afford!

The third and final phase of this project is to add a watering system to the hillside and relandscape, adding trees and wildflowers. Hopefully we will be able to do this work in 2007 with the assistance of a second CAP award.

In summary, the Association is busy helping make this a great neighborhood. But, we are going to need a number of new volunteers to help us keep the Association a viable organization. I hope that everyone appreciates all the services. But services without volunteers don't happen. Please consider exploring how you can help us keep this neighborhood such a special place.
