We are coming off a very successful year, our 18th official year, having started as a Neighborhood Association in 1997.

Let me share a bit of Association history that is still very relevant today.

In 1997, the Founding Committee was composed of Rob Davis, Kathleen Heritage, Ron Mak, Rob Rice and Pat Treadwell. Note that Ron Mak is still one our our neighbors and is still involved with our Association, currently serving as our Treasurer! Thanks Ron.

This Founding Committee met each Monday for more than a month, after the first general meeting on February 3 of that year. It was determined then that our Association would be a voluntary organization focused on providing three key benefits. They were (and still are)

Project Detail

Traffic Calming

The speed limit in our neighborhood is 25 mph. Given the design of our streets, especially the long straight stretch of road on Pfeiffer Ranch, many of us exceed 40 mph without even being aware of our excess speed. Recently four deer were hit and killed along this stretch of road, both times by cars seemingly exceeding the speed limit. In the past, we have posted signs, investigated speed bumps and humps and posted neighbors to waive signs as cars pass by.

Our new goal is to investigate the use of a radar speed feedback sign. Our preliminary research suggests that when drivers are made aware of his or her speed, drivers adjust accordingly. As we get more information on this possibility, we will share our thinking in an upcoming newsletter.



Project Detail

CC&R Review

When our development was established by Pinn Brothers, they established a set of Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions, commonly called CC&R's, to help ensure that our neighborhood continued to be an attractive and pleasant place to live. Our CC&R's closely match the City of San Jose's Municipal Code.

Historically, the role of the Association in regards to the CC&R's has been informing our new neighbors of their existence and advising existing neighbors of any perceived issues. Over the past few years we have not done a good job informing everyone as to their existence.

Over the past year, we have received "concerns" from neighbors on trailers in driveways and long-term vehicle street parking that are actually addressed in our CC&R's. This project is designed to reeducate ourselves on their existence and content and highlight the most important elements. We will develop an education campaign to help all of us be fully informed. Again, as we develop our campaign, we will share it in an upcoming newsletter.

Additionally, we will be posting our complete set of CC&R's on our website.

Open Space Maintenance Program

The Association maintains five (5) different "open space" areas within our neighborhood boundaries. They are:

- Front entrance Graystone sign and wall area
- Pfeiffer Ranch block retaining wall area and hillside
- Pfeiffer Ranch property between the trail and the street
- Stonehill the hillside adjacent to the open space
- Boulder Mountain Way & Rocky Crest the hillside adjacent to the open space

The four areas around our homes are addressed every week and the large land area along Pfeiffer Ranch is trimmed once a quarter. Pictured below is just a sample of the trimmings from one week's work along Boulder Mountain Way. Our landscaping bill is almost \$4000 a year.
